Policy plan 2024 Stichting Ghost Diving

Foreword by the chairman

Stichting Ghost Diving is incorporated on February 11, 2020 in Katwijk. The foundation has been based in Rotterdam, The Netherlands since 2023.

The objectives of Stichting Ghost Diving are:

- Making the underwater problems caused by lost fishing gear and other waste worldwide visible to the public. Creating awareness of the problem called 'ghost fishing' to a wide audience in general;
- The removal of underwater waste, including fishing nets, lines and other marine debris by voluntary diving teams;
- Investigating and documenting local situations;
- Ensuring diving safety during under water waste removal through training and instructions;
- Committing to recycling marine debris and to cooperate with companies specialized in these processes;
- Sharing knowledge and best practices with other organizations;
- Education, for example by giving presentations; and
- To cooperate with other diving teams and other relating organizations.

'Ghost Fishing' is what fishing gear does when it has been lost, dumped or abandoned in the seas and oceans. Imagine a fishing net that gets snagged on a reef or a wreck and gets detached from the fishing vessel. Nets, long lines, fish traps or any man-made contraptions, designed to catch fish or marine organisms, are considered capable of ghost fishing when unattended. Without anyone profiting from the catches, they are affecting already depleted commercial fish stocks. Caught fish die and in turn attract scavengers which will get caught in that same net, thus creating a vicious circle.

It is estimated that 640,000 tons of fishing gear gets lost or abandoned in the seas and oceans each year. They are among the greatest killers in the oceans, and not only because of their numbers. Literally hundreds of kilometers of nets and lines get lost every year and due to the nature of the materials used to produce these types of gear, they can and will keep fishing for multiple decades, possibly even for several centuries.

To this day, the Ghost Diving team has carried out diving projects independently or in collaboration with several international environmental and/or diving organizations like: Healthy Seas Foundation, Greenpeace, WWF, Global Ghost Gear Initiative and Global Underwater Explorers. It goes without saying that, to be able to realize its objectives, Stichting Ghost Diving needs partners which are willing to contribute by funding these projects and taking actions.

Please appreciate that this policy plan is drawn up for the purpose of applying for an ANBI (Public Benefit Organization) status and therefore limited to the requested information.

Mission, challenges & strategies

Mission

Stichting Ghost Diving is driven by volunteer technical divers who carry out lost fishing gear removal projects and raise awareness the general public about the ghost fishing issue on a global scale.

Challenges & strategies

'Ghost Fishing' is what fishing gear does when it has been lost, dumped or abandoned in the seas and oceans. Imagine a fishing net that gets snagged on a reef or a wreck and gets detached from the fishing vessel. Nets, long lines, fish traps or any man-made contraptions, designed to catch fish or marine organisms, are considered capable of ghost fishing when unattended. Without anyone profiting from the catches, they are affecting already depleted commercial fish stocks. Caught fish die and in turn attract scavengers which will get caught in that same net, thus creating a vicious circle.

o Physically removing nets, fishing gear and other marine debris

Since 2009, our volunteer divers have removed hundreds of tons of lost fishing nets, fishing gear and other marine debris from shipwrecks, reefs and the seabed, gaining valuable experience and at the seabed, gaining valuable experience and at the same time perfecting our own techniques.

Documentation (photo/video)

The power lies in making the problem of ghost fishing visible. Stichting Ghost Diving works with professional underwater photographers and film makers to document its actions for evaluation and presentation purposes.

Ensuring diving safety

Stichting Ghost Diving sticks to standards & procedures to reduce risks to a minimum. Stichting Ghost Diving offers advice on diving safety.

Recycling marine debris

Some types of marine debris such as fishing nets (plastic) and weights (lead) can be recycled. Stichting Ghost Diving collects these materials in close collaboration with Healthy Seas Foundation.

Sharing knowledge and best practices

Stichting Ghost Diving has extensive knowledge of many types of fishing techniques, marine waste and identifying marine life. Stichting Ghost Diving likes to share this knowledge and is willing to learn from others.

Education & presentation

Stichting Ghost Diving gives educational presentations to (diving) clubs and during meetings, exhibitions and shows.

Projects & planned activities

The volunteer team of Stichting Ghost Diving, carries out diving projects independently of in collaboration with several international environmental and/or diving organizations among which are Healthy Seas Foundation, Greenpeace, WWF, Global Ghost Gear Initiative and Global Underwater Explorers. The volunteer divers operate within the following localized Ghost Diving chapters, which Stichting Ghost Diving is continuously expanding.

Stichting Ghost Diving is therefore very interested in worldwide collaboration with other diving teams and likes to start or participate in existing projects all over the world.

In addition to the regular and annual activities in the Dutch North Sea, we have planned several bigger projects for 2024 in collaboration with Healthy Seas Foundation. The dates of which will be determined during the year:

- Ghost Farms, Greece (Multiple Projects)
- Battle of Convoys, Lampedusa
- HMS Perseus, Greece

Audience

Since we all profit from a better planet and healthier seas worldwide, Stichting Ghost Diving has no specific limitation on its target group.

To accomplish its mission, Stichting Ghost Diving collaborates worldwide with various local group of technical divers and salvage companies to remove lost fishing gear. Its awareness raising work focuses on the general public, children and schools to promote the ecological and economic importance of healthy seas and the environmental damage caused by 'ghost fishing' gear.

Financing Stichting Ghost Diving

The initial budget of the initiative has been allocated as direct funding or in-kind contribution and the opportunity is offered to other business partners and stakeholders to join.

(Potential) funding sources

Stichting Ghost Diving receives:

- Partnership fees / donations from partners;
- Public donations;
- Contributions from the public via crowdfunding.

Further external funding sources are needed to continue and expand the initiative.
